

DON ANDERSON HONORED reported in the Connection

NEW NU'UANU Y GYM NAMED FOR HIM

Allen-Stone Chapter's **Don Anderson**, retired CEO of the Honolulu YMCA, was honored Dec. 11 with the announcement that the planned \$40 million rebuild of the Nu'uana YMCA will feature the Don Anderson Gymnasium.

Don, who established a long-lasting YMCA partnership with the Honolulu Rotary Club more than 20 years ago to build homes, schools, health clinics, and more throughout the Pacific, became a close friend of Nan Shin, founder and owner of Nan Inc. Construction.


The pair worked side by side on nearly countless volunteer building projects. Nan Inc.'s \$1 million gift to advance the Nu'uana campaign in December included the request that the new gym be named after Don.

The Nu'uana YMCA, the flagship branch of the Y, was established in 1918 in the heart of the city. The current campus buildings date to the early 1960s. The rebuilt facilities will include two affordable housing towers, a new gymnasium for its myriad wellness and healthcare programs, senior services, and pre-school. Construction is expected to begin in 2027 and be completed in 2029.

Don and his wife, Susan, live in Honolulu, where he continues to organize new projects, having recently returned from one in the Philippines.

NATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT UPDATE

Short update on National Service Project. By Gary Huff



A wonderful community celebration of the completion of 4 new, beautiful tiny homes was held September 21 at the YMCA of the Seven Council Fires in Dupree South Dakota. Hundreds attended to say thank you and well done to all involved. All 4 homes are now occupied with single mother families. All managed by the local Y.

The total raised for the National Service Project is now \$1,036,000. A new \$20,000 gift was recently received. At present, \$178,000 will be available to build the Y program Twig in La Plant, South Dakota.

The design of the Twig is near completion. Preliminary designs show the use of the two 40 x 10 foot containers, side by side, with a good looking facade built in and around them. A ground floor will provide 1,025 sq ft of program space and a second level will house a staff member needed for program leadership. A hard deadline is set for completion in 2026. Request for volunteers will be coming out in the new year.

Christmas gift to Tiny homes project

A new exciting gift was announced by the Y of the Seven Council Fires just before Christmas day. An anonymous donor, inspired by a story, on our project, in the New York Times, has donated solar panels for all 4 tiny homes. The donor has also donated the money necessary to fully build a 5th tiny home to fit with the others in the Morningstar community. WOW! Good deeds beget good deeds.

Nancy Stifel became a YMCA Director in very small steps.

In 1980's Nancy was living in her hometown of Newington, CT (just a few blocks from where she grew up) with husband Rich Torgan, son Scott and daughter, Leigh. Her husband was given a job transfer to Columbus, Ohio. The family packed up and settled on a home 20 miles east in rural Licking County. With kids off to new schools, Nancy started volunteering at local Y. In short order, she was offered a job running their Saturday Fun Club. Seeking more hours, Nancy then started that YMCA 's first women's classes, starting with the Aerobics craze.(This Y still had a 2nd floor full of male residents)

She was then given the opportunity to open a new Nautilus Facility Camp; then build out a Women's Fitness facility! The Licking Y had a 6 acre campus with 2 outdoor pools. They also owned Camp Nelson Dodd, a long-shuttered 12-acre resident camp. Visiting the closed Camp with her Indian Guides, they found eight buildings in good shape. A plan was created to move 5 cabins down to the Newark Y and start a Day Camp. Indian Guides dads included executives at Owens-Corning, Dow Chemical and State Farm which had headquarters. So flatbed trucks were hired, and a crane, to lift the cabins and transport them. More adventures followed, for years! Ask me more when we meet!

Portland YMCA Camp Meehan Reunion September 2025

Fred and Sally Stickney headed up a one day reunion of 52 former Camp Meehan staff and campers from Washington, Oregon and California at YMCA Camp Collins in Troutdale, Oregon on September 27, 2025.

When Fred was the Director of the John R. Leach branch of the Portland YMCA, he was tasked with the reopening of Camp Meehan in 1968. It had been closed from 1962, after damage by the Columbus Day storm, which battered Washington state. In 1969 Fred started up new summer camping programs at Meehan, while rebuilding the infrastructure of the camp. Many of the volunteers working on the refurbished buildings, were campers or staff from earlier years and included Bob Smeenk, who was on the Portland YMCA staff.

The September reunion included the participants from 1968 to 1979, before the Mt. St. Helens eruption destroyed the camp completely in May of 1980. The reunion was a day of sharing all the wonderful parts of Camp Meehan, reminiscing, stories, pictures, singing camp songs and remembering camp individuals we have lost. Camp Meehan had a long history as it began in the 1930's and Scotty Washburn, an Allen-Stone member, shared stories of his first camp experience there. In the late 90's Fred and Scotty were able to bring a group of former campers of Scotty's era together in Salem who then donated memorabilia of their camping time to the Cowlitz Museum in Longview Washington. The Longview YMCA camp which was located next our camp, can relate to what Camp Meehan lost on the day Mt. St. Helens came alive.

Secours Spéciaux HISTORY OF THE FUND

The Secours Spéciaux Fund was established in the 1950s in response to the closure of YMCAs in Eastern Europe under communist regimes, which left many dedicated staff and volunteers in crisis. The initiative began with Mrs. Anna Limbert, whose personal commitment to support affected YMCA members inspired broader organizational involvement.

Over the decades, the Fund has been sustained by the generosity of YMCA retirees and supporters worldwide. In 1997, it was officially prioritized by the World Fellowship of YMCA Retirees (WFYR), with South Asia leading the first organized campaign. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Fund responded swiftly to the urgent needs of the YMCA community. Financial assistance was extended to nearly 100 retirees facing health, economic, and social challenges as a result of the crisis—offering comfort and stability during an extraordinarily difficult time. Today, the Secours Spéciaux Fund continues to provide vital support to retired YMCA staff and volunteers in countries across Africa, Asia, and Latin America—honoring their service with dignity, solidarity and hope.


